Preparing for Winterall

Everyone:

- Proper cold-weather clothing- gloves, hat, and waterproof boots, no gym shoes (Scouts with inadequate clothing or footwear will be sent home.)
- Can of soup, or chili per person (Chicken, beef, or tomato-based only)
- Kindling and tinder for fire building event
- Snow Snake
- Klondike Sled with cooler for transporting, storing dry clothes, water & Race
- Compass
- First Aid Kit
- Patrol Flag & Yell

Boy Scouts should bring the following:

Ingredients and equipment for desert cook-off, tarp (at least 6'x8'), cold-weather camping gear (Mummy bag and closed-cell pad), troop flag, and food for Friday night and Saturday morning
