

Gifts in Kind

Gifts-in-kind is a simple concept whereby the Boy Scouts accept the donation of a product that it would normally have purchased through its annual operating budget. The key is that the donated product meets the specifications of what would have been purchased; making the item donated a "budget relief" for the council.

Specific Support

Specific project support is a concept whereby the Boy Scouts account and credit specific costs related to a particular program or activity from the operating budget. The costs are separated and written up as a "project" so that the potential donor knows exactly what he or she is supporting financially. This is an excellent way to match donor interests with specific budgetary expenses that are already a part of the council's operating budget.

Summary

Remember, program support is a unique method for you or your company to make a meaningful contribution to the Three Fires Council, Boy Scouts of America. A supporter may donate the cash to purchase the specific project that the TFC has in its budget. Or they may donate the actual item.

How Can I Help?

Membership

• Fall Membership Campaign: Budgeted items needed for a successful fall membership campaign. Items will include printing, postage, flyers, kickoff expenses and other costs to market and promote Scouting programs.

Approximate Cost: \$10,000.

 Disadvantaged Youth Assistance: Scouting and TFC will never refuse a child based on an inability to pay. This project includes assistance to youth for registration, uniforms, books, camperships, and program expenses.

Approximate Cost: \$150 per Scout \$5,000 per unit

Parent Orientation Guide: Printing costs for parent orientation guide to be distributed during the fall membership campaign to all new Cub Scout parents. Research has shown convincing parents is the key to recruiting kids into the program. Spanish and English versions available. *Approximate Cost: \$3,500*

Council Operations

Council Annual Report: Annual report is distributed every June at the Council's annual meeting. Report is also distributed to Chartered partners, United Ways, volunteers, and interested community members.

Approximate Cost: \$5,000

Council Newsletter *The Flame: The Flame* is the Council's monthly electronic newsletter circulated to approximately 8,000 volunteers and community supporters. Project includes costs for email subscription.

Approximate Cost: \$1,000 per issue

- Council Calendar: Council calendar lists important District and Council dates and is distributed to each unit to assist with monthly planning. *Approximate Cost:* \$1,500
- Executive Committee Meetings: Project includes costs associated with meetings held throughout the year (7 meetings). *Approximate Cost: \$225 per meeting*
- Annual Meeting: Costs associated with the Council's annual meeting in June. *Approximate Cost:* \$500
